## Revelation 10-11 Bible Study

1. Write down any questions or insights you have from your reading and preparation for the Bible study.

2. Is the "mighty angel" in Revelation 10, an actual angel or Christ Himself? See also, Revelation 1:1; 1:7,16; 4:3; 5:5; Amos 3:7-8; Exodus 13:21-22; 14:24.

3. Where and how does the angel stand and of what might this be symbolic? Verses 10:2,5-6. See also, Genesis 1:6-10, 14:22; Deuteronomy 32:40; Revelation 5:13; Daniel 12:7; Ephesians 1:10, 20-22

4. What or who might the "seven thunders" be who answer the angel in verses 10:3-4 and why is it that John was told not to write it down but to seal up what they said? Consider verse 10:6.

 What is John told to do with the scroll in the angel's hand and why is it sweet to taste but bitter in his stomach? Revelation 10:8-11. See also, Ezekiel 3:1-3, 10-11.

6. Why is it that John is given a measuring rod to "measure the temple of God and the altar and those who worship there," in verses 11:1-2? What is he not to measure and why? Consider as well, 1 Corinthians 3:16-17; Ephesians 2:20-22; 1 Peter 2:4-10; Revelation 3:12, 21:22.

7. Who are the two witnesses (or who might they symbolize) that suddenly appear in verse 11:3 and how long do they prophesy? What are they able to do and what is amazing to Hal about it? See also, Revelation 11:4-13; Zechariah 4:6-14; Malachi 4:5; Revelation 1:6-7, 5:10.

 When does the beast overcome the two witnesses and where does this take place? What is the world's response to their deaths and how long are they dead? Verses 11:3, 7-13. 9. What happens when they are resurrected? Verse 11:13. See also, Matthew 27:51-53.

10. What happens after the seventh angel blows his trumpet in Revelation 11:15?

11. What is seen when God's temple in heaven is opened to be view and why might this be significant?Verse 11:19; see also, Genesis 12:1-3.
